THE LARGEST EAB INFESTATION IN NY IS IN YOUR AREA!

**EAB is an invasive beetle from Asia that kills Ash trees
Infested trees die rapidly and become very hazardous**



Small 1/2" Green Metallic Beetle

ULSTER AND GREENE COUNTY ARE UNDER QUARANTINE FOR EAB



**Movement of firewood and ALL Ash wood is under regulation

KNOW YOUR ASH

Identify the ash trees on your property. Note trees that pose a danger.

DEVELOP A PLAN

**Consider removing and replacing large older trees in hazardous locations
Individual trees can be treated with a systemic insecticide applied by a certified applicator**

KNOW THE SIGNS OF EAB
